Teej -- Here's what worked really well for me. When I started to get interested in pedals, I went out and spent about \$100 on a multi-effect pedal. These things dont necessarily sound spectacular, but the amount of experimenting you can do with them is ridiculous. They have everything from chorus, reverb, flange to delay and auto wah, some detuning, octave shifting, even amp/cab and pickup modeling. I picked up the digitech RP80, and though I don't really use it for much on my pedal board now (besides a volume pedal), it's still one of the best investments I have made guitar-wise.
